Chapter 3 - Saturday 13 May: Seeheim to Solitaire

This part of the trip was mainly just hard and dedicated driving with landscape really becoming more interesting and surprisingly mountainous as we approached the Solitaire region. We had stopped for a few groceries and in Keetmanshoop and also in Maltehohe
